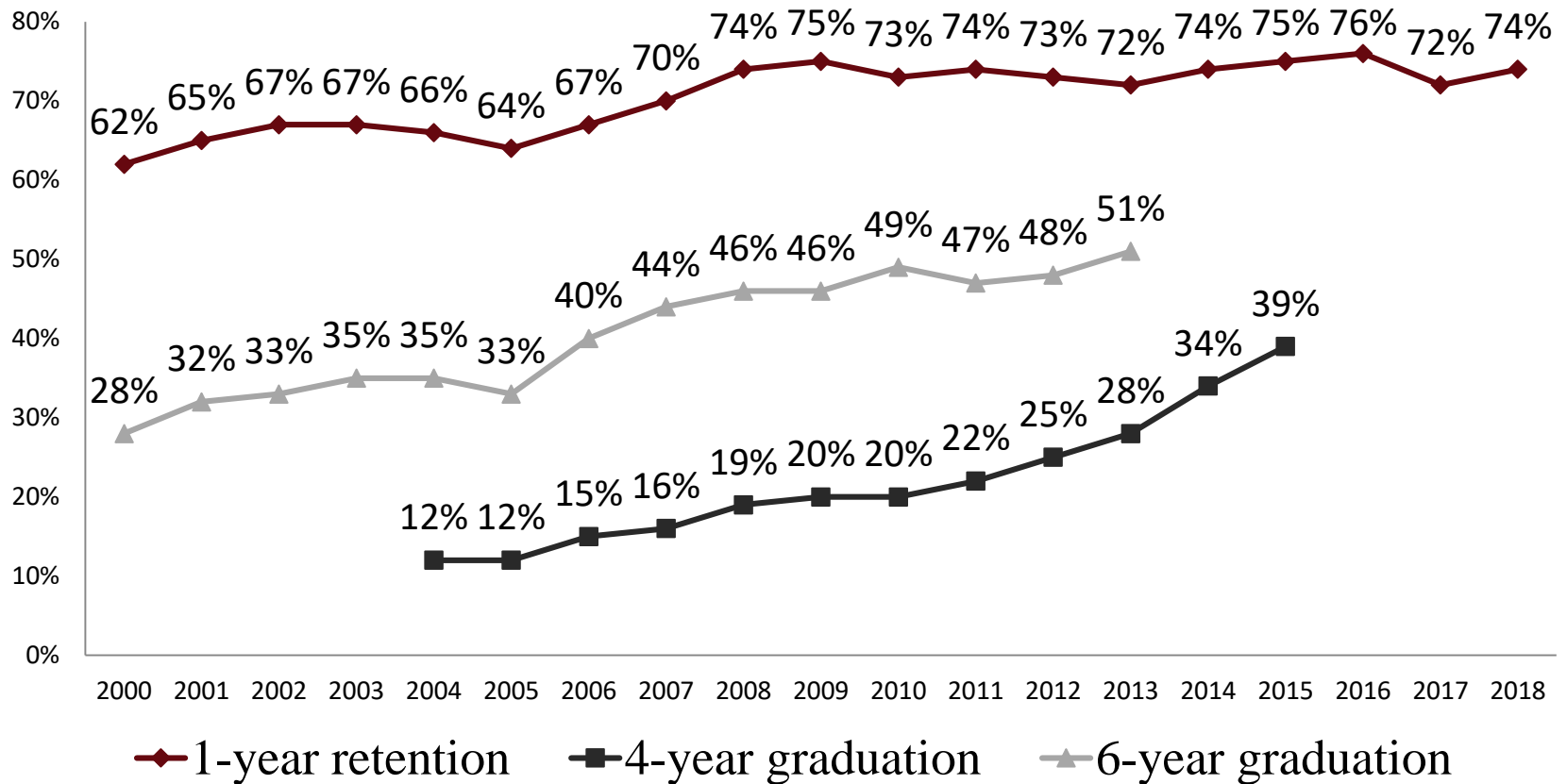

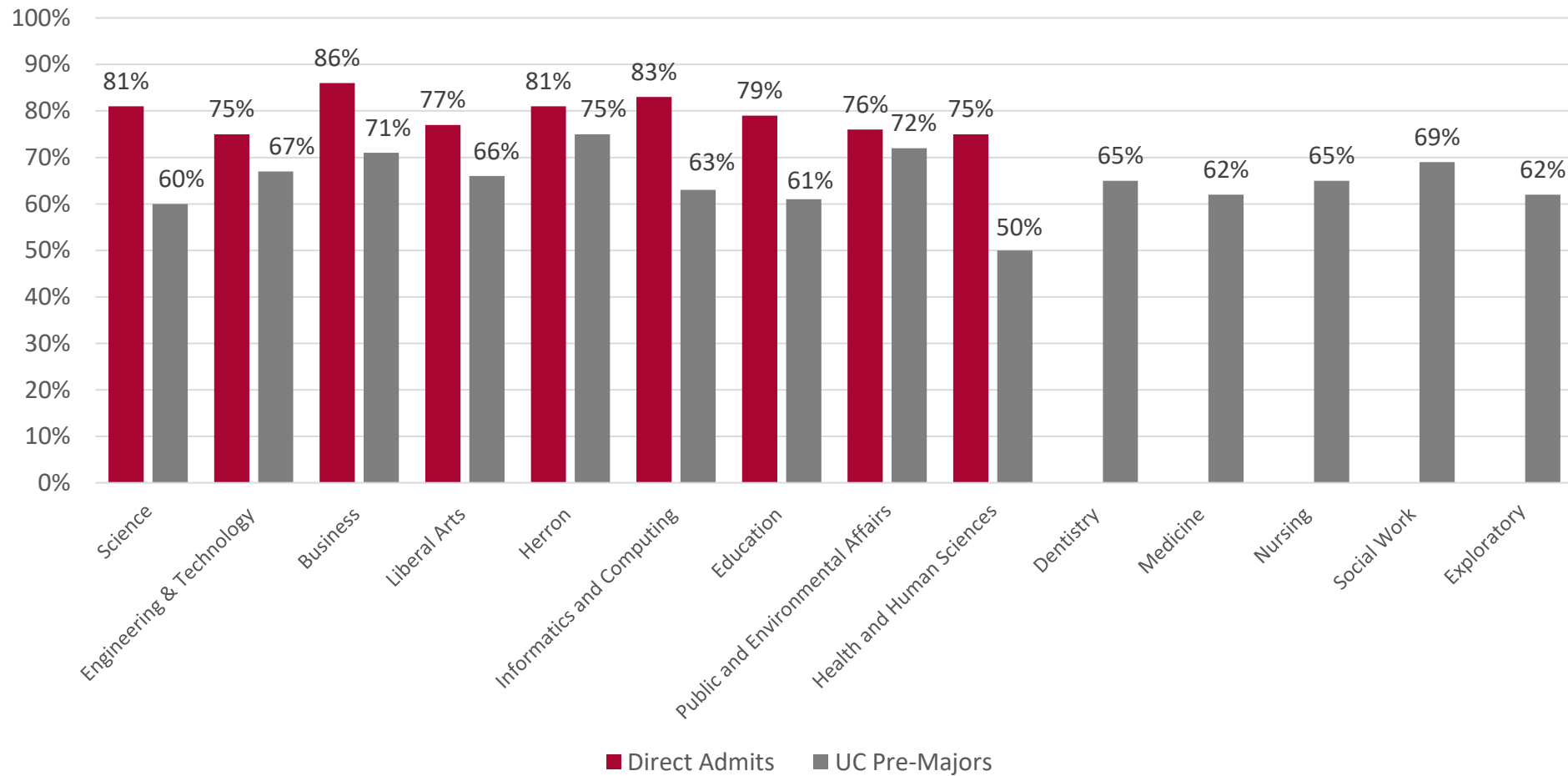

One-Year Retention – Retained at IUPUI Indianapolis

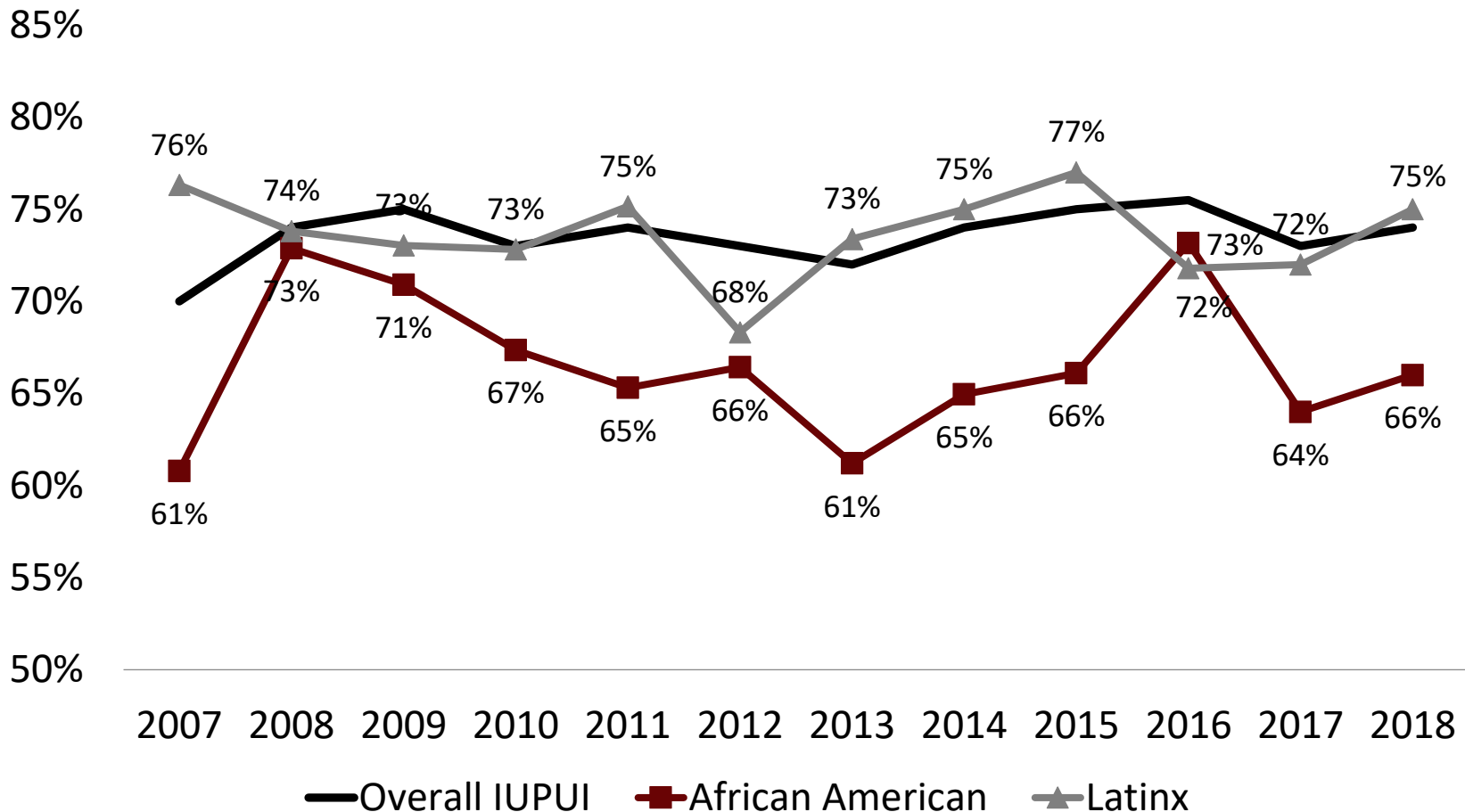

Special Focus on Wayne State University

- ❖ APLU recently named Wayne State University winner of 2018 Degree Completion Award.
- ❖ Invested more than \$10 million in student success.
- ❖ Hired professional academic advisers.
- ❖ Improved curriculum in general education courses.
- ❖ Increased support for faculty teaching development.
- ❖ Enhanced support for underprepared students (academic, career, research, financial literacy, and mentoring support).
- ❖ Implemented first-year experiences for new students.
- ❖ Increased financial aid for low-income and first-generation students (students receive scholarship or grant funding support that covers the full cost of tuition and fees).
- ❖ Created the WSU Warrior Way Back Program, a debt forgiveness program for adult learners who cannot return to college because of past-due balances.
- ❖ Used data and analytics: established a student retention and tracking system to monitor student progress.

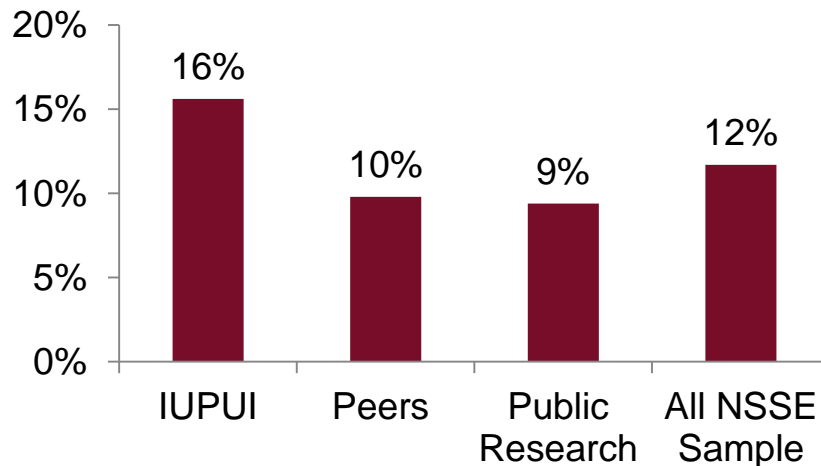


Most Students Work and Attend Classes

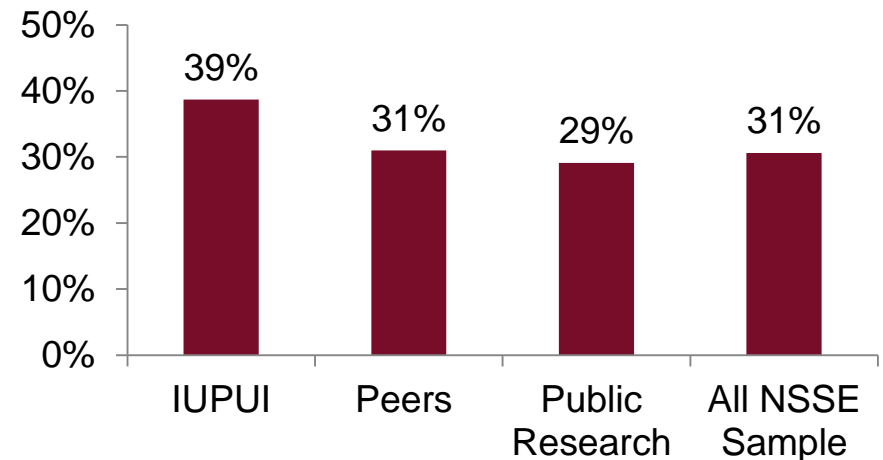
1. 62% of 2019 beginners plan to work for pay off campus

Definition of Unmet Financial Need

The National Common Data Set provides a framework for calculating a student's academic year financial need that is "met" by different sources of financial support. **Unmet Need** is the portion of a student's academic year financial need that exceeds these forms of financial support.

Calculation Example

Cost of Attendance (COA)

1. Tuition/fees, housing/meals, books/supplies, travel, and personal expenses = \$24,000

Expected Family Contribution (EFC)

1. A FAFSA-driven expectation of family financial support - \$10,000

Gift Aid

1. Scholarships, grants, etc. from federal, state, IUPUI, and private sources - \$1,000

Self-Help Aid

1. Subsidized federal loans and federal work study earnings - \$8,000

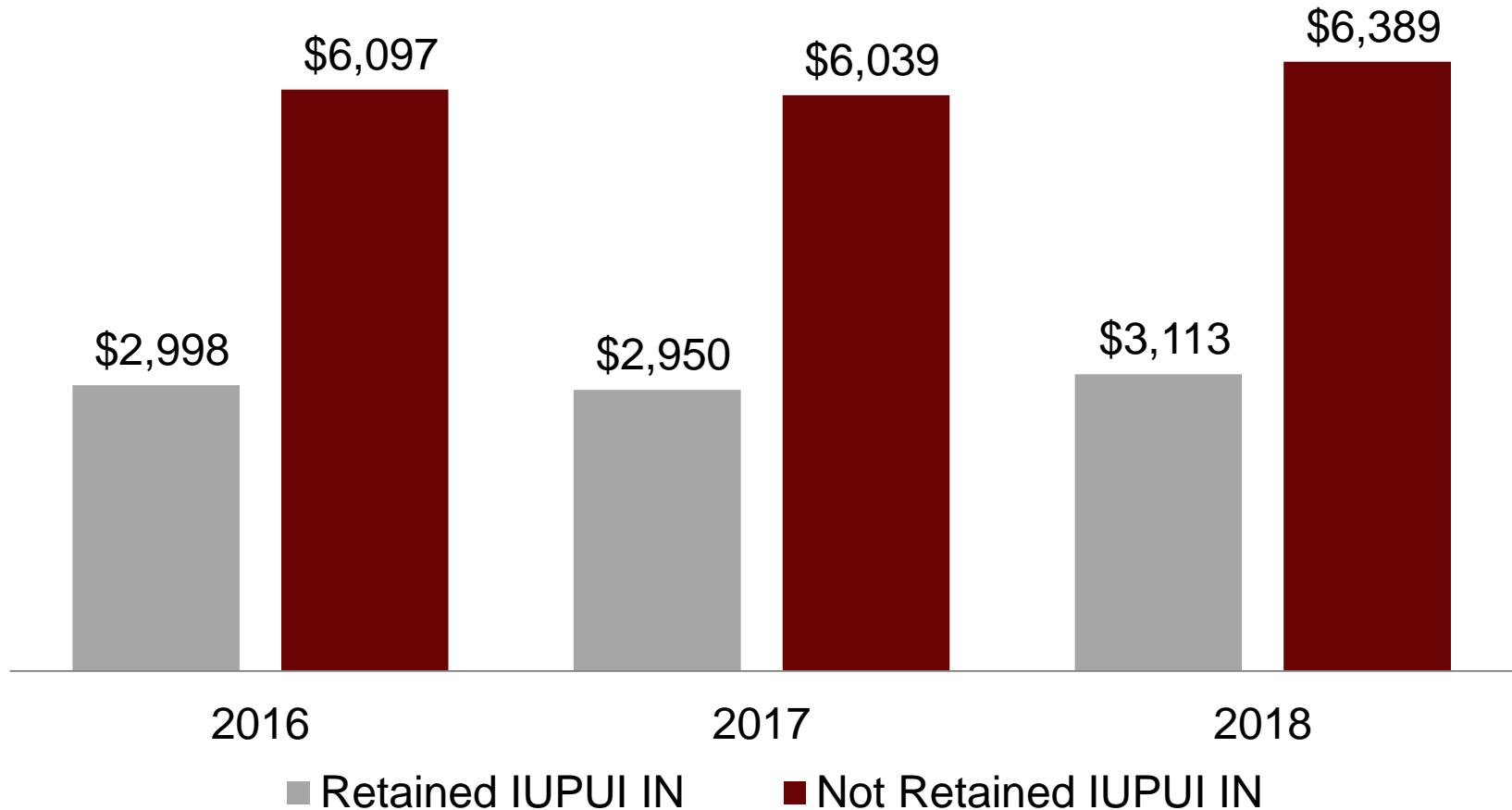
Difference is **Unmet Need** = \$5,000*

* Students must take out unsubsidized loans, private loans, or work to support unmet need
