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INTRODUCTION

The IUPUI alumni survey began in 1992 with funding IUPUI received as part of the 1990 Perkins Vocational and Applied Technology Act. In 2011, the survey was revised and a Graduate Alumni Survey was created. The current iteration of the IUPUI Graduate Alumni Survey was created by staff in Information Management and Institutional Research (IMIR) with feedback from Deans, Associate Deans, the Center for Service and Learning, and Career Services. The original Undergraduate Alumni Survey, the results of the 2008 Graduate Student Survey, and the IUPUI Principles of Graduate and Professional Learning (PGLs) were consulted when constructing this survey. Currently, the Graduate Alumni Survey has 5 sections focusing on graduates' satisfaction with their overall IUPUI experience, satisfaction with their assistantship, the impact of IUPUI on their learning, further education, and current employment.

A sample of 4,134 graduate students who graduated with a Master's, Doctoral-Practice, or Doctoral-Research degree from any Indiana University or Purdue University school located on the IUPUI or IUPUC campus between Spring 2008 and Summer 2010 was provided to IMIR by the Indiana University Alumni Association. All alumni in this sample were sent an e-mail inviting them to participate in the survey. Of the 4,134 students contacted, 1,397 of those had invalid e-mails and two declined to participate, leading to an adjusted sample size of 2,735. Reminder e-mails were sent to non-respondents two, four, and six weeks following the initial e-mail. A total of 401 alumni responded to the survey for a response rate of 14.7%. Demographic and academic characteristics of Kelley School of Business and all respondents appear in tables 1 and 2 below.

The following is a report of the 46 respondents who received a Master's degree from the Kelley School of Business at IUPUI. In order to demonstrate the extent of the difference between the scale means of schools and the scale mean for all IUPUI Master's respondents, effect sizes were generated. Effect sizes represent the number of standard deviation units between the school and campus means. In general, an effect size with an absolute value of less than 0.2 of a standard deviation is seen as "trivial," and an effect size with an absolute value of 0.2 or greater is meaningful. Prudence should be considered when interpreting these results, as the low response rate for this survey may have led to results not consistent with the entire IUPUI population. 





Which category best describes your employer?





gross salary fall?






