

Welcome to the 2018 IUPUI Entering Student Survey Report

The Entering Student Survey (ESS) is a yearly survey administered during New Student Orientation sessions. The ESS is designed to gather information about students' needs, time commitments, expectations, educational goals and more. The survey is voluntary and students complete the Qualtrics-based instrument during a dedicated time period during orientation to ensure that we understand the support and resources they need to make successful transitions to IUPUI. Of the 3,649 beginning freshmen in the 2018 cohort, 1,937 completed the Entering Student Survey. The response rate was 53%.

Key Highlights Overall

- Overall beginning student respondents feel welcomed at IUPUI. About 94% of students agree 'the IUPUI campus community has made me feel welcomed.'
- Nearly 89% of respondents agree they are 'proud to tell others I am going to school here.'
- Respondents indicated high levels of Psychological Grit with 87% reporting high levels of being hard working and 71% reported they 'finish whatever they begin.'
- Sixty-five percent of respondents reported having 'some concerns' about financing their college education while 56% are 'satisfied' or 'very satisfied' with the amount of financial support they have received so far.
- More than one-third of beginner respondents (38%) indicated that they plan to prepare for class (studying, reading, writing, doing homework, etc.) more than 20 hours per week.
 66% of students plan to work for pay on-campus while 62% plan to work off-campus for pay during their first year.
- When respondents were asked to compare themselves to other students, they rated their 'ability to work with others that are different from you' as the highest while rating their 'study skills' as the lowest.
- Top 5 reasons respondents reported choosing IUPUI were 'Availability of specific academic
 programs', 'Availability of financial aid/scholarship', 'Graduates get good jobs', 'Job, career, and
 internship opportunities available in Indianapolis while attending school', and 'Career and job
 opportunities available in Indianapolis after I complete my degree.'
- A little more than half (58%) of students felt there is a 'Very good chance' they will be satisfied with college life.'
- Four of the top five factors students reported in choosing their major involve their major being
 aligned with personal characteristics within themselves such as their interests, skills and
 abilities, and personality.
- Seventy-nine percent of respondents reported either 'no chance' or a 'small chance' that they will transfer from IUPUI to another college.
- While a majority of students (53%) plan for a Bachelor's degree to be the highest degree they obtain, 45% of respondents plan to obtain a Graduate degree (Master's or Doctorate).
- In both 2017 and 2018, the number one reason respondents chose IUPUI was the 'Availability of specific academic programs (majors).'
- Fall 2018 beginners rated their confidence levels significantly lower than the previous year in the following ability areas: academic, mathematical, leadership, and working with others different from themselves.
- A number of Entering Student Survey items significantly predict student success such as where students plan to live during their first year, self-efficacy ratings, planned participation in high impact practices and time spent in external commitments such as working for pay off campus and taking care of household responsibilities (see page 17).
















ACADEMIC FUTURE

What Is the Highest College Degree You Expect to Obtain?





What is the likelihood that you will transfer from IUPUI to another college?




EXPECTED LIVING SITUATION

KEY HIGHLIGHTS IN COMPARISONS BETWEEN 2017 AND 2018

A means comparison analysis was conducted between the 2017 and 2018 cohorts of beginning students who took the Entering Student Survey. For four areas of questions a construct was formed to better analyze differences between the 2017 and 2018 cohorts. Two of the four constructs were significant at the .05 level.

ENTERING STUDENT SURVEY PREDICTORS OF STUDENT SUCCESS

A series of logistic regression analyses (retention) and linear regression (Fall GPA) were conducted to examine the entering factors that significantly predicted one-year retention rates (retained at IUPUI) and first-term or Fall GPA. The table below displays the findings. Results are based on 2017 Beginner Cohort Entering Student Survey Results (n=2,281). The covariates used in analyses were: HS GPA, SAT Score, and Received a Federal Pell Grant. All items are significant at the p<.05 level.

Key Highlights

- A number of factors significantly predicted student success (One-Year Retention and/or First-Term GPA) including the
 following: concerns about finances (-); time planned to spend engaging in external commitments (working off-campus,
 commuting to class, taking care of household responsibilities) (-); self-efficacy ratings in mathematical ability (-), study skills (+)
 and more; participation in high-impact practices (+).
- The following were among the factors affecting students' decisions to attend IUPUI that significantly predicted student success (these may be indicators of fit or the IUPUI environment being aligned with expectations): size of IUPUI; social climate/activities at the college; type of housing available on campus; and job, career, internship opportunities available in Indianapolis while attending classes.
- Where students planned to live in their first year significantly predicted one-year retention rates and their first-term GPA. Students who expected to live in campus housing had higher retention rates and average first year GPA than students who expected to live off campus.





WHERE THEY PLAN TO LIVE MATTERS IN PREDICTING ONE-YEAR RETENTION


One-Year Retention Rate IUPUI




Average Year 1 Cumulative GPA at Census



WHICH BEST DESCRIBES YOUR EXECTED LIVING SITUATION DURING YOUR FIRST YEAR?




One-Year Retention Rate IUPUI

ORGANIZATIONAL COMMITMENT CONSTRUCT


One-Year Retention Rate IUPUI
