

Welcome to the 2017 IUPUI Entering Student Survey Report

The Entering Student Survey is a yearly survey administered during New Student Orientation sessions. Students complete the online Qualtrics-based survey during a dedicated block of time to ensure they have enough time to complete the survey. The survey is voluntary and students are encouraged to complete it to ensure that we understand the support and resources they need to make successful transitions to IUPUI. Of the 1712 transfer students in the 2017 cohort, 160 completed the Entering Student Survey. The response rate was 9.3%.

Key Highlights Overall

- Overall transfer student respondents feel welcomed at IUPUI. About **94**% of students agree 'the IUPUI campus community has made me feel welcomed.'
- Slightly more than half of respondents (52%) strongly agree they are 'proud to tell others I am going to school here.'
- Respondents indicated high levels of Psychological Grit with 72% reporting high levels of being hard working and 72% high levels of 'I finish whatever I begin.'
- 59% of respondents reported having 'some concerns' about financing their college education while 51% are 'satisfied' or 'very satisfied' with the amount of financial support they have received so far.
- Less than half of beginner respondents (40%) indicated that they plan to prepare for class (studying, reading, writing, doing homework, etc.) more than 20 hours per week. 44% of students plan to work for pay on-campus while 77% plan to work off-campus for pay during their first year.
- Transfer students rated their 'ability to work with others that are different from you' as the highest ability while 'study skills' was the lowest.
- Top 5 reasons respondents reported choosing IUPUI were 'Opportunity of an IU or Purdue Degree', 'Availability of specific academic programs,' 'Graduates get good jobs,' 'IUPUI's reputation,' and 'Career and job opportunities available in Indianapolis after I complete my degree.'
- About 52% of students felt there is a 'Very good chance' they will be satisfied with college life.'
- 4 of the top 5 factors students reported in choosing their major involve their major being aligned with personal characteristics within themselves such as their interests, skills and abilities, and personality.
- While a majority of students (54%) plan for a Bachelor's degree to be the highest degree they obtain, 37% of respondents plan to obtain a Graduate degree (Master's or Doctorate).
- A number of Entering Student Survey items significantly predict transfer student success such as ability to manage finances, motivation for college work, social confidence (related to social activities), relaxing and socializing (watching TV, partying, etc.) (see page 14).














How committed are you to your current major?






ACADEMIC FUTURE

What is the highest college degree you expect to obtain?




What is the likelihood that you will transfer from IUPUI to another college?




EXPECTED LIVING SITUATION
